If the equations were done step-by-step with more thorough explanations explicitly on the ppt slide Prof. Hascakir's lectures would be a very good reference (vs. the book, which also has difficult to follow examples because some minor but background details are excluded).

According to Bloom's taxonomy for learning, I think that Dr. Hascakir was more successful in the understanding and application stages than the remembering stage. She is especially good at explaining difficult material through examples and analogies, which helps students really understand the material. However, there is too much material to cover in the class and thus she goes through the material quite fast. I believe that a better way to make students remember is to have quizzes testing the basic terms/ theory after the discussion of each process, so that students are required to review/study the notes after class. I think that the lack of quizzes or exams makes students not being as motivated to remember the basic terminology. The class activities however, help with the application stage as students are required to apply (calculate or discuss) what is being covered in lecture, which improves understanding as well. Moreover, I like how she would incorporate her lab results/research into the class activities so that research feels feasible and important. In terms of the analyze and evaluate stages; I think that EOR was a good class for analysis but not so good for evaluation. The class activities that required discussion were helpful and the fact that the midterm project was pretty specific (focused only on one process per team) made the teams able to understand and analyze the process very well. However, I think that asking questions to other teams really doesn't help in evaluating other's work that well because it is easy to find something relatively easy to ask from the power point slides the night before without being fully interested in the answer. Dr. Hascakir is very interested in research and the creating stage of Bloom's taxonomy, and this is shown through the final project that requires a proposal to solve a problem. My team hasn't completed this task yet so I couldn't say how successful we were at creating, but Dr. Hascakir really tried to achieve this goal.
